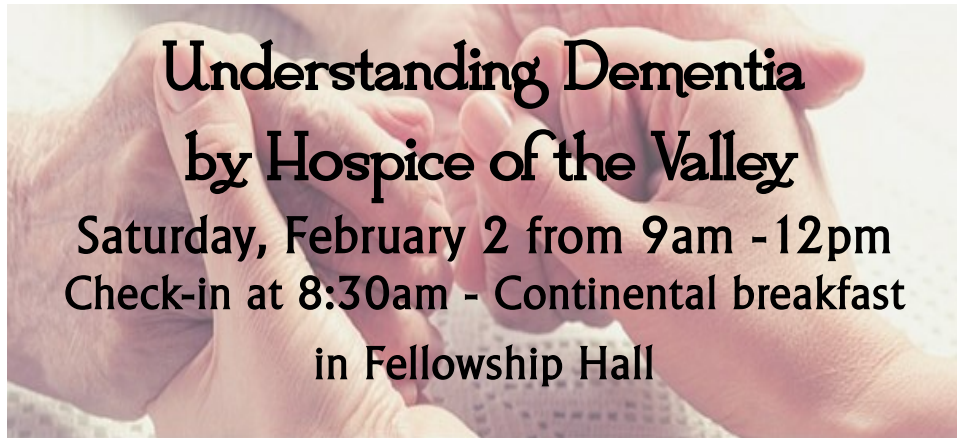


Understanding Dementia by Hospice of the Valley
